This important event commemorates the "Great Ejection" in 1662 of many ministers from the Church of England, eventually leading to the founding of many Unitarian and non-conformist congregations.

There will be a walk to the church for a special service after a celebratory meal, which is a traditional part of proceedings. So if you want to book for the meal you need to put your name on the noticeboard, as there is only a limited number of places. Anyone who wishes may join the walk and the congregation at Rivington, where many other Unitarians from the area are expected. ## UDDY BOOTS







# FIRST AID AND DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

Would you know what to do in a medical emergency? Do you know how to operate a defibrillator? Have you watched all the re-runs of Holby City and



Causality, but now feel a bit rusty on your resuscitation techniques?

Whatever your level of training or experience, a basic knowledge of first-aid is essential to help you stay calm in a medical emergency, respond appropriately and perhaps even save a life.

Rochdale Unitarian Church, in partnership with the Red Cross, are offering a <u>FREE</u> First-Aid course, which includes training in the use of a defibrillator that is soon to be installed in our building.

The one-day session presupposes no previous knowledge, but would probably be useful also for those who have had training in previous years and would like a refresh.

The venue will be Rochdale Unitarian Church, on Thursday 5th September, from 1.30pm.

Since we've already had a lot of responses already to our announcement, it is likely a second session will be arranged at a later date for those who are unable to join us on the 5th.


