COMMUNITY PAYBACK

In case you hadn't noticed, the terraced area to the front of Church is being cleared and our well established and overgrown laurel bushes which have for some time obscured both the building and our signage have been pruned back.

We have also taken the opportunity to prune the bushes and clear the area to the Holland Street frontage as it turns the corner towards Spotland Road. The ownership of this land is a little unclear but the original plans for our present building suggest that the area to the front and side of Church is leased from Rochdale Council on a 999 year term, which commenced in 1818.

Paul Hubbard, on our behalf has arranged for the Community Payback team to attend to our requests and as this edition goes to press, teams averaging 5 people have spent 2 full days cutting back and clearing away. They have still another day's work left in which to finish off and tidy away.

For those who are not aware people can be sentenced to do unpaid work that benefits the community.

Magistrates or judges can sentence offenders to carry out anything from 40 to 300 hours of unpaid work as part of their order. Community Payback must include a minimum of a day's work – lasting at least seven hours – once a week.

People can also be sentenced to intensive Community Payback orders, which mean they must complete 28 hours of work every week.

Across Cheshire and Greater Manchester, people on probation complete roughly half a million hours of Community Payback every year. All projects combine hard work and the chance for the participant to develop skills. It is also a punishment as the individual is giving up their time to carry out the work.

Community Payback projects vary from maintaining the grounds of parks; churches; cemeteries; local football; cricket and sports clubs; schools and parks through to helping to run clubs for the elderly and vulnerable adults with learning difficulties. In addition, offenders who have been rigorously risk assessed can also be placed directly with charities and community groups, such as helping to run charity shops.

Community Rehabilitation Companies were launched following the Government's Transforming Rehabilitation reforms that came into effect in 2015. The reform created 21 CRCs to supervise offenders assessed as posing either a low or medium risk of committing a serious crime.
