REALLY EASY CAULIFLOWER SOUP (Serves 4)



(Cooler weather is likely on the way - here is a recipe to counteract that)

- 400g cauliflower florets
- 300ml whole milk
- 200ml water or vegetable stock
- Salt & pepper to season

Put cauliflower florets in large saucepan with milk, water or stock with salt and pepper.

Bring just to boil over medium heat, then turn down heat and simmer for 10-15 mins till cauliflower is tender.

Using slotted spoon, remove cauliflower from cooking liquid and transfer to a blender.

Add half cooking liquid and blend on high speed until smooth.

Add remaining liquid, taste and adjust seasoning.

Serve piping hot with hot buttered toast.

UTURE CHURCH

Special Congregational Meeting – held to discuss our future ministry

As reported in the August Messenger, Abi completed ministry training with OneSpirit Interfaith Foundation and is now recognised as Reverend after her



ordination which took place in July. Because of her close association with Church and the invaluable help she gave us during this, our interregnum period, General Council approached Abi to see if there was any possibility of putting our association on a more formal basis.

We are very pleased to report that after a few discussions with Abi and with the unanimous approval of members of the congregation at our special congregational meeting on 19th September, this is now likely to become reality.

Because of our relatively small membership it was felt that at 50% appointment would be better suited to our needs and finances. Abi too has other commitments and so it was agreed that initially we would have an interim 6-month period to allow both the congregation and Abi time to assess the feasibility of the arrangement and work/life balances etc.

Abi will not be on the GA Roll of Unitarian Ministers and as such she will not have the support structure normally associated with it. We therefore approached our good friends the Reverends John & Beryl Allerton who were delighted to be involved and offer any ministerial support that may be necessary.

Council considers this to be an exciting time for the congregation of our church and look forward to a long and happy relationship with Abi and her family.

We are pleased to offer the opportunity to hear the fascinating story of an unique love story between an English Roman Catholic priest and a young South African nurse during the time of apartheid.


Explore faith, politics, love and a culture full of hope, diversity and tradition.
